C.A.R. PROJECT SUPPORTS EQUINE THERAPY FOR VETS

The Children of the American Revolution (C.A.R.) is the nation's oldest and largest nonpolitical patriotic youth organization. A new C.A.R. state project that will aid veterans has been announced. The goal of "Operation Horse" is to raise \$2,000 during the next year to fund equine-assisted therapy for two N.J. veterans

with Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). The therapy is offered through the Man o' War Project of Columbia University Irving Medical Center.

The mission of the Man o' War Project is two-fold. Equine-assisted therapy is used to treat veterans with PTSD while medical staff evaluate the program to develop best practices for administering equine-assisted therapy. This research can have far-reaching benefits for treating veterans and all who suffer with PTSD.

C.A.R. membership is open to girls and boys from birth through age 21 who are descended from a person who aided the cause of independence during the American Revolution.

New Jersey has nine C.A.R. groups known as societies. Activities offered on an age-appropriate basis help members learn about American history, government, community service and more. Members also gain valuable leadership experience conducting meetings and serving as delegates at state and national conferences.

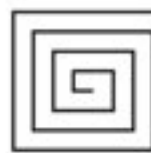

MHS THEATRE DELIVERS DONATIONS TO PROJECT LINUS

Morristown High School Theatre Program

Morristown High School Theatre recently delivered four bags of blankets and blanket-making supplies to Project Linus. The supplies—which included yarn, fabric, sewing supplies, and a couple of Michaels gift cards—were donated by theatergoers who attended MHS production of *Fiddler on the Roof*, a critical and box-office smash for the student-run program.

Project Linus is a non-profit organization that provides handmade blankets to children 18 and under in the United States who are “seriously ill, traumatized, or otherwise in need.” Inspired by the character of Motel the tailor in *Fiddler*, MHS Theatre encouraged members of the program, friends, family, and show attendees to donate homemade no-sew blankets and supplies for Project Linus at each of the four performances of *Fiddler on the Roof*.

Sisters Abby and Caroline Higgins made the delivery of the collected donations to the

Hunterdon and Warren Counties branch of Project Linus in Bloomsbury, NJ. Abby, a graduating senior, is MHS Theatre’s head of community outreach, while Caroline, a freshman at the high school, joined the outreach team in this, her first year in the MHS Theatre program.

“I have been watching my sister’s efforts in community and educational outreach since her sophomore year of high school,” says Caroline. “I have seen her grow this program into the award-nominated one that it is today, and, from watching her, I, too, have grown a passion for helping the community. She has shown us how to go above and beyond expectations and what effort and hard work can do.”

Indeed, (as of this writing) Abby was recently nominated for Montclair State University’s Foxy Award for Educational Impact and Community Outreach for her work on both last fall’s dramatic production of *Little Women* and MHS Theatre’s spring 2025 musical production

of *Les Misérables*, just as she was for 2024’s *Mary Poppins* and *Shakespeare in Love*. Higgins has also twice been nominated for Paper Mill Playhouse’s Rising Star Award for Educational Impact (for *Mary Poppins* and *Les Misérables*).

The delivery coincided with Project Linus’s “Make a Blanket Day” workshop, at which volunteers, including the Higgins sisters, made 213 blankets to donate to children in need. For Abby, who will be attending Elizabethtown College in the fall to pursue a major in occupational therapy, the visit to Project Linus was a rewarding conclusion to her time as MHS Theatre’s Community Outreach.

“Seeing the amount of participation in the blanket-making when we visited filled me with hope and gratitude,” said Abby. “It reminded me of the reason I wanted to be in charge of the Community Outreach branch of MHS Theatre—to utilize the arts to help as many people as I can.”

"Performing Joaquín Rodrigo's celebrated *Fantasia para un gentilhombre*, Samuelčík promises to enchant listeners, pairing the concerto's historic elegance with his signature vibrant energy and technical brilliance."

"What I love about the piece is its elegance, colour, and contrast," Samuelčík says. "The guitar creates a dialogue with the orchestra."

MOUNT VERNON SCHOOL RESTORATION COMPLETED

County of Morris

Restoration of the historic Mount Vernon School, also known as the Red Brick Schoolhouse Museum in Chatham Township, has been completed following several years of preservation work supported by more than \$305,000 through the Morris County Historic Preservation Trust Fund.

Morris County Commissioner Director Stephen Shaw recently visited the circa 1860 landmark to present a Morris County Historic Preservation plaque to Chatham Township Mayor Jen Rowland and the Chatham Township Historical Society in recognition of the successful restoration project. The visit followed Morris County's annual Pathways of History weekend on May 2 and 3, when the museum welcomed visitors from across the region.

"Preserving our history is always a priority in Morris County, and this year it carries even greater significance as we celebrate America's 250th anniversary," said Director Shaw. "The Mount Vernon School is a wonderful example of the historic places we are proud to protect for future generations."

Originally constructed around 1860, the building later received a vestibule addition around 1900 and a rear addition in 1958. It served as a local school and Sunday school until 1928 before later housing community organizations and Chatham Township Hall. The building was eventually repurposed as a local history museum.

Since 2019, \$305,450 in Morris County historic preservation grants have supported a National Register nomination, a preservation plan, construction documents and extensive exterior restoration work.

The 2022 and 2023 grants supported repairs to deteriorated brick and mortar, reconstruction of the northwest vestibule corner, restoration of stone window lintels and sills, and installation of interior storm windows to help preserve the building.

"We're so grateful for all the support and all the funding. The Red Brick Schoolhouse is a beloved

site in town -- not only because it holds so much history for us and our residents -- but it is the destination for field trips for our students. This is a field trip that they remember and they continue to come back with their grandparents and parents," said Mayor Rowland.

"Morris County has been with us since the beginning of the process. From the preservation plan and National Register nomination to the construction documents and restoration work, we could not have completed this project without the county's support," said Martha Wells, president

of the Chatham Township Historical Society.

Since 2003, the Board of County Commissioners have approved more than \$56 million in Morris County Historic Preservation Trust Fund grants to help preserve and restore 136 historic sites across the county.

As part of the county's commemoration of America's 250th anniversary, the Chatham Township Historical Society (CTHS) also featured the RevolutionNJ "Revolutionary Lives" exhibit during Pathways of History weekend.

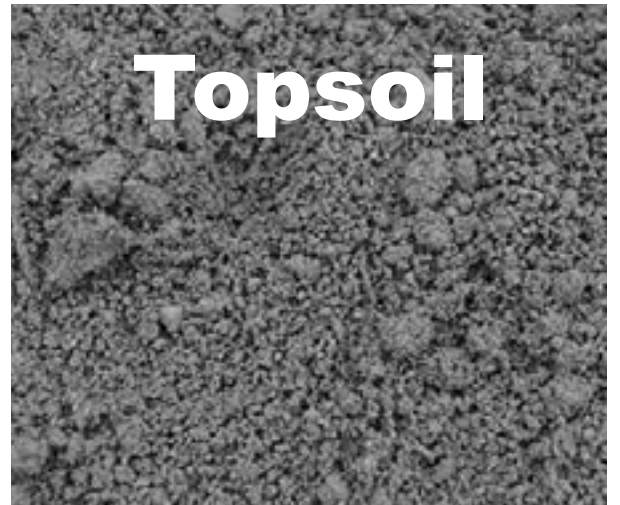

MORRIS COUNTY HONORS NATIONAL POLICE WEEK 2026

County of Morris

National Police Week is observed this year from May 10 through May 16, with Peace Officers Memorial Day commemorated on May 15. The observance dates to 1962, when President John F. Kennedy designated May 15 as a national day of remembrance for law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty and the week in which it falls as "National Police Week."

This week also marked the 30th anniversary of the Police Unity Tour, founded in 1997 in Florham Park by Police Officer Patrick Montuore. What began as an 18-member bicycle ride from New Jersey to the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial in Washington, D.C., has grown into a nationwide movement with thousands of participants who honor fallen officers and support their families.

"In July 1975, two Florham Park police officers, Detective Frank Dailey and Patrolman Robert Hauptman, were killed in the line of duty when their plane crashed during a marijuana interdiction operation. It was a tragedy that deeply impacted Morris County," said Sheriff Gannon. "Twenty-two years later, Pat Montuore

began the Police Unity Tour ride to Washington, D.C. I've had the opportunity to participate, and there is tremendous camaraderie throughout the journey. When riders arrive at the National Law Enforcement Officers Memorial, there is a great deal of emotion, and the experience is meaningful for both survivors and fellow law enforcement officers."

"Our police officers are dedicated to protecting our communities from criminals intending to commit crimes and victimize our citizens. We all need to pay them sincere respect and support their efforts, as they literally accept all risks and facedown those subjects with intent to harm. Tragically, some pay the ultimate price for their provided protection," said Prosecutor Carroll. "We want our law enforcement officers and all those currently serving to know we are here to support them, and request that our citizens to say 'thank you'."

Thirty law enforcement officers are among the 43 police officers, firefighters and emergency responders memorialized on the 200 Club of Morris County monument at the Morris County Public Safety Training Academy.

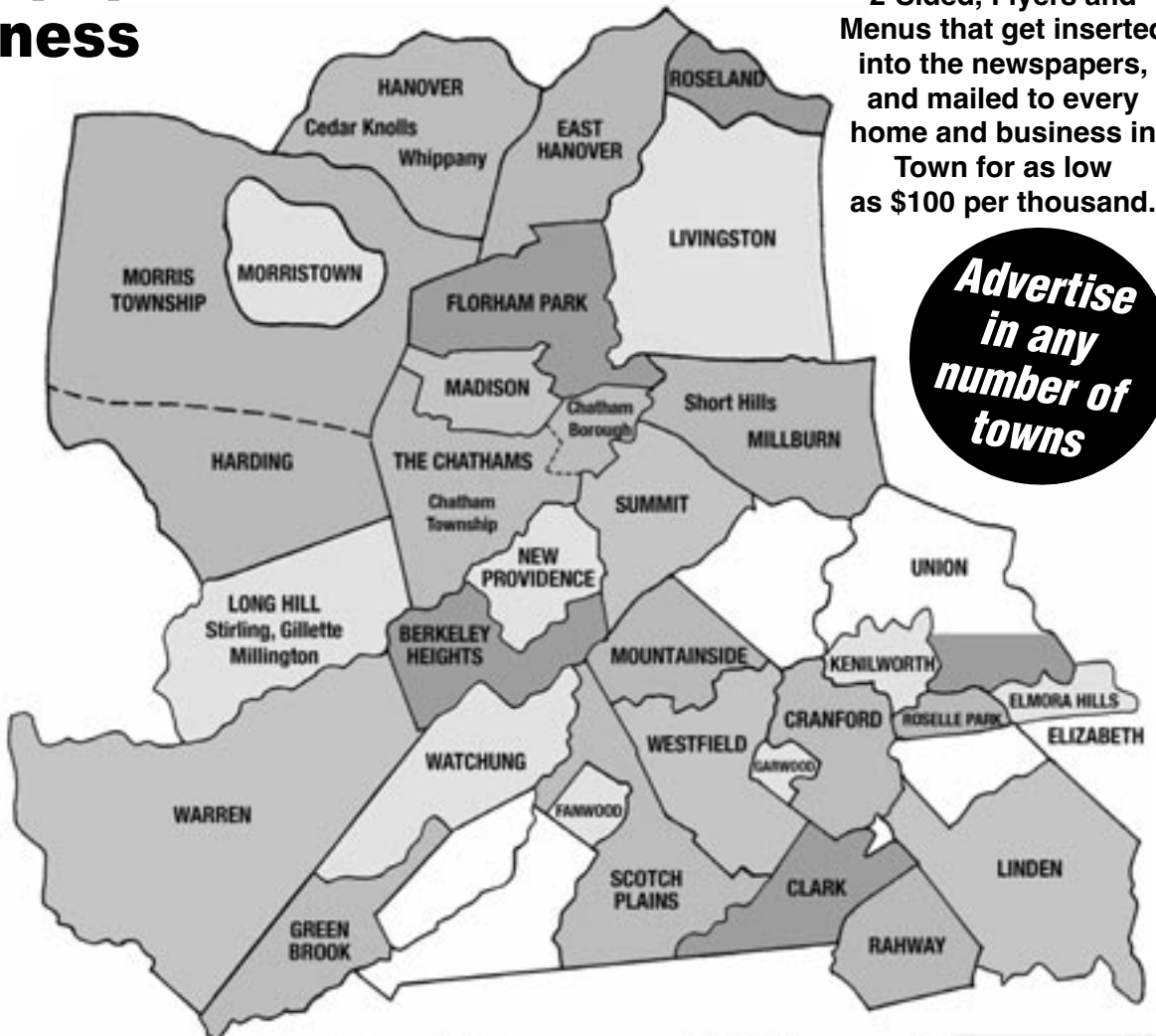

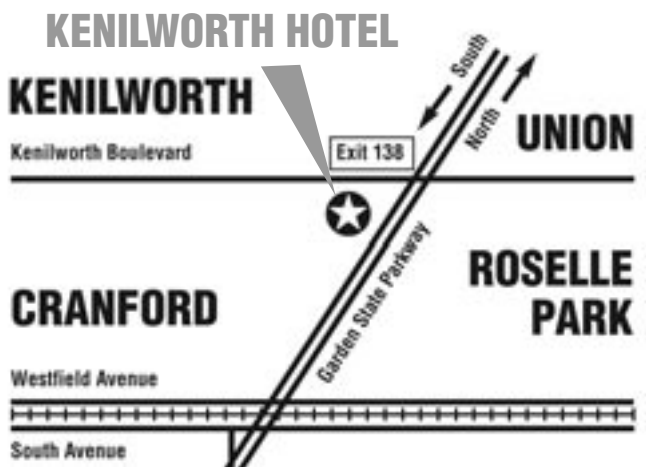
