EXPLORING ANIMAL SAFETY AND AWARENESS

Scouts from Cub Scout Pack 182 recently enjoyed an exciting and educational pack meeting focused on understanding animals and how to stay safe around them. Led by Den Leader and veterinarian Dr. Melissa Shendell, the Scouts learned about animal body language and how animals communicate through posture, movement, sounds, and behavior.

Dr. Shendell shared her expertise to help Scouts recognize the differences between familiar household pets and animals they may encounter outdoors throughout New Jersey. Scouts learned how to identify warning signs that an animal may feel threatened or scared, and why it's important to give unfamiliar animals space to avoid

dangerous situations.

The Scouts also explored how to use their senses while outdoors—learning to spot footprints, listen for animal sounds, and notice smells or other clues that animals may be nearby. Through interactive discussion and real-life examples, Pack 182 Scouts gained valuable knowledge about respecting wildlife, being observant, and making safe choices.

This hands-on and fun-filled meeting helped build confidence, awareness, and curiosity—making it a pack meeting to remember!

GREEN BERETSERGEANT FIRST CLASS JAKE FERNANDEZ SPEAKS TO STUDENTS

SCVTHS

As part of his ongoing effort to bring history to life, Somerset County Vocational and Technical High School (SCVTHS) instructor Ed Graf recently invited Green Beret Sergeant First Class Jake Fernandez to speak to his students.

Students researched and prepared questions for SFC Fernandez, a New Jersey native and veteran of multiple combat tours overseas, on the history of conflicts around the world. The conversation centered around how Green Berets have supported the efforts of the United States during the Cold War and the War on Terror. This enabled students to not only learn about the history of these conflicts, but also to get experience interacting with a primary source – a person who has direct knowledge of an event.

Throughout the class, students learned about the discipline, determination, and mental toughness that Green Berets are known for. SFC Fernandez also highlighted the necessity of persevering when overcoming obstacles and developing creative solutions to adverse situations, both on and off the battlefield.

When asked what she took away from the presentation, SCVTHS senior Francesca Boian said “SFC Fernandez was really down to earth. I appreciated the honest way he answered our questions and how he gave us a unique perspective about the military that we couldn’t get from books.”

SHE WAS A 48-YEAR-OLD MOM FROM BERKELEY HEIGHTS... TERRIFIED TO WEAR A LITTLE BLACK DRESS AT HER DAUGHTER'S WEDDING - UNTIL THIS HAPPENED

When guests gathered for a recent summer wedding in town, expectations were clear: a beautiful bride, proud parents, heartfelt speeches, and a lively dance floor.

What no one expected was that one of the most talked-about moments of the night would involve the bride's mother.

As Helen, 48, walked down the aisle in a fitted dress with a tastefully exposed back, heads turned. Conversations paused. By the time the reception was underway, it was clear this mother of the bride had made an impression few would forget.

LISA LONTAI HONORED FOR HER SERVICE

The Warren Township Historical Society, jointly with the Warren Township Historic Sites Committee, has honored former township Mayor Lisa Lontai with a Certificate of Appreciation 'in recognition of her many years of service to our community and exemplary dedication to the cause of historic preservation.' According to Society president Alan A. Siegel, pictured on the left, Mrs. Lontai showed "determined leadership last year" as she shepherded through the Township Committee a funding measure that enabled the Historic Sites Committee to rehabilitate the Egg-O-Mat, one of Warren's last remaining symbols of its rural past. The Egg-O-Mat, a coin-operated egg vending machine, had stood for decades on the old Epstein farm on Mountain Boulevard, opposite the library, providing Warren residents with farm-fresh eggs 24 hours a day, seven days a week. After a shopping mall was built on the site, the vending machine was put in storage, where it remained for nearly a quarter of a century as local historians tried unsuccessfully to raise funds for its restoration and eventual display. "It was Lisa Lontai who made it happen," said Historic Sites Chairman Greg Fitzgerald, in the photo on the right, "and for that the people of Warren are grateful." The Egg-O-Mat has been restored to its original appearance and is now a feature of the Wagner Farm Arboretum on Mountain Avenue.

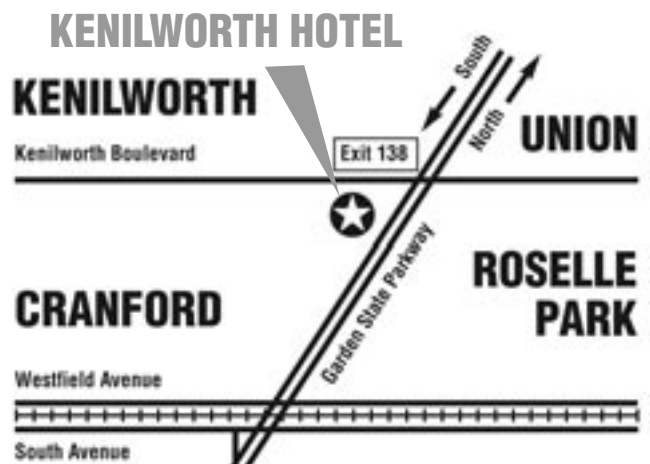

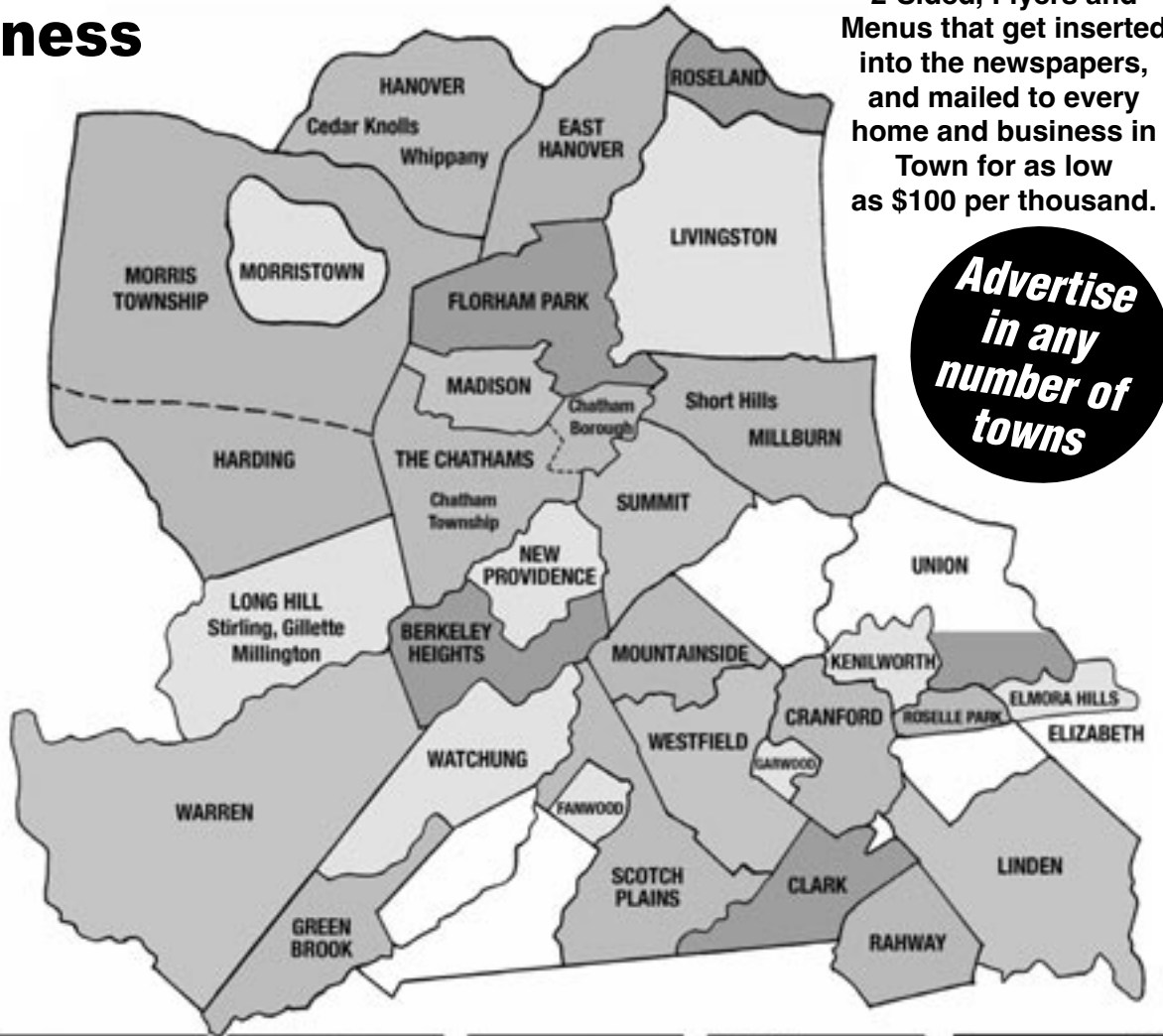
