The Morristown Rotary Club is pleased to announce the recipients of its Spring 2026 community grants. This cycle highlights the Club's commitment to supporting essential local services that provide safety, healing, and technological modernization for the most vulnerable members of our community.

"Our local non-profits are the backbone of Morris County," said Aaron Oliver, President of the Morristown Rotary Club. "By investing in these specific programs, we are helping to remove barriers to mental health care, improve the living conditions for families in crisis, and streamline the efforts of those providing grief support to our youth."

SPRING 2026 GRANT RECIPIENTS:

THE DEIRDRE O'BRIEN CHILD ADVOCACY CENTER ("DEIRDRE'S HOUSE")

Funding will support the expansion of the center's Transportation Program and the implementation of HIPAA-compliant mental health appointment reminder software. These initiatives aim to reduce missed appointments for child abuse victims by addressing economic and logistical barriers to care, ensuring children continue to receive forensic and medical services at no cost.

This initiative helps child victims of abuse safely arrive on time to their clinical counseling sessions, ensuring they continue receiving the care and support they need." JERSEY BATTERED WOMEN'S SERVICE, INC. (JBWS):

Grant funds are designated for the "Teen Room Upgrade" within the JBWS domestic violence emergency shelter. This capital improvement project includes the purchase of new furniture, computers, and fixtures to create a dedicated, modern space where teenagers can study and decompress while staying in the shelter with their families.

GOOD GRIEF, INC.:

The Morristown Rotary Club is providing support for critical technology enhancements for the "Nights of Support" peer program. This funding will facilitate the purchase of iPads and Wi-Fi extenders, allowing the organization to transition from a paper-based system to a digital platform. This shift is expected to significantly reduce administrative hours, allowing staff and volunteers to focus more resources on direct grief support for children and young adults. Christian Heiss, Executive Director of Good Grief noted "The Rotary Club of Morristown has been an amazing supporter of Good Grief. We are so appreciative of this grant, which will help our volunteers hold space for grieving kids and families with a little less paper".

The Morristown Rotary Club funds these grants through community-wide fundraising efforts and the dedicated service of its members. Since its founding, the Club has remained a steadfast partner to Morristown's non-profit sector.

ED FOUNDATION AWARDS \$189K DISTRICT-

As the school year comes to a close, the Morris Educational Foundation (MEF) continues investing in innovative educational opportunities that benefit Morris School District students well into the next academic year. Thanks to the generosity of donors, the Foundation recently awarded three grants totaling \$42,050 bringing the total amount the MEF has invested in grants alone for District students this school year to more than \$189,000.

The MEF funds transformative staff-requested programs, resources and experiences that enhance learning throughout all 180 days of the school year and are not covered by the District's operating budget or local tax dollars.

The following grants were approved at the June 8th Morris School District Board of Education meeting:

BRINGING LEARNING TO LIFE: DRAMATIC PLAY FOR KINDERGARTEN KNOWLEDGE UNITS

Piloted at Woodland School, materials will be provided to help kindergarten students strengthen oral language, vocabulary development, and social-emotional skills through developmentally appropriate dramatic play experiences.

CULTURAL ARTS FOR ALL 10 DISTRICT SCHOOLS

Funding to support cultural arts programs in schools to ensure students continue to engage in performances and initiatives that spark curiosity, fuel creativity, and unlock potential.

FMS FALCON FLIGHT CREW PEER LEADER PROGRAM

Support for 8th-grade peer leaders to attend training at YMCA Camp Bernie to help incoming 6th graders feel welcomed, build positive connections, and develop life skills during their transition to middle school.

Throughout the year, MEF-funded classroom grants have supported real-world STEM experiences, arts residencies, cultural enrichment performances, wellness initiatives, and innovative projects across the District. This latest round of funding demonstrates that the Foundation's work doesn't end when the school year does, it continues to invest in programs that will enrich the educational journey of students next year and for years to come. Highlights and updates from these grants are shared on the Foundation's social media pages, celebrating the real impact of community support.

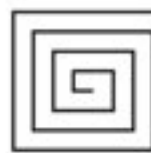

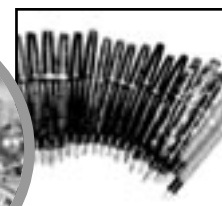

PASSING THE TORCH AT 250: HOW NORTH JERSEY'S NEWEST ENLISTEES CARRY AMERICA'S LEGACY FORWARD

Veteran organizations often serve as the backbone of community support for those who have served in the military. Yet, one group is uniquely transforming how America honors its newest service members—before they even don the uniform. While traditional groups like the Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) and the American Legion focus primarily on veterans returning from conflict, Our Community Salutes (OCS) dedicates its mission entirely to the next generation of patriots: high school seniors stepping into the U.S. Armed Forces.

As communities across the nation prepared for Fourth of July celebrations and looked forward to America's milestone 250th birthday, the work of Our Community Salutes of North Jersey stood as a powerful reminder of what local support truly meant.

Founded in 2009 by educator and Army veteran Dr. Kenneth Hartman, OCS was created to fill an important gap in community recognition. While college-bound seniors receive enthusiastic decision-day applause and student-athletes draw local headlines for signing with sports teams, military enlistees often quietly slip away to basic training without public acknowledgment. Our Community Salutes ensures these young men and women are the first to hear a collective "thank you" from their hometown.

The organization operates on a three-pronged

support model. For enlistees, public recognition ceremonies provide resources, mentorship, and a sense of pride to ease their transition into active duty. For families, educational tools, community connections, and peer networks that help parents and siblings navigate the military journey. For communities, a collaborative platform uniting local business leaders, veterans, educators, and elected officials to honor local defenders.

Each spring, the North Jersey chapter of OCS brings this essential mission into focus. Recently, the group hosted its 10th Annual Enlistee Recognition Ceremony at Fairleigh Dickinson University's Florham Campus in Madison, New Jersey.

At this high-profile event, more than 90 high school seniors from across northern New Jersey were honored as they committed to enlist in the Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Coast Guard, or National Guard. Surrounded by active-duty military leaders, veterans, local dignitaries, and emotional families, these young patriots received a formal send-off recognizing their induction into the elite "less than 1% club" of Americans who wear the uniform. To further support families, OCS introduced programs like OCS Connect, designed specifically to build community for those at home during their loved ones' military journey.

As America approaches its Semiquincentennial—its 250th birthday—the thread connecting these North Jersey enlistees, today's veterans, and the original patriots of the

Revolutionary War becomes profound. It is an unbroken chain of everyday citizens choosing extraordinary sacrifice.

In 1776, the Continental Army was built by farmers, blacksmiths, and tradesmen who swapped civilian tools for muskets to defend the ideal of freedom. Many marched through northern New Jersey, known as the "Crossroads of the Revolution," enduring hardships such as brutal winters in Morris and Bergen counties. Today's veterans have inherited the responsibility of maintaining peace through decades of global conflict. Now, these high school enlistees—stepping onto the same historic Jersey soil—carry forward that legacy by voluntarily safeguarding American liberty. Just as only about 3% of colonists fought for independence, today's service members represent a committed minority protecting the majority.

Many historical battles that were won long ago are celebrated on the Fourth of July. But organizations like Our Community Salutes remind us that freedom is an active, ongoing relay race. By honoring the new generation of military enlistees, OCS ensures that the legacy of American liberty remains vibrant.

The act of honoring veterans isn't just about looking back - it is an investment in the future of the nation. Through grassroots support and community recognition, these young patriots receive a powerful message: their sacrifice is valued, their service is celebrated, and their legacy is America's ongoing story.

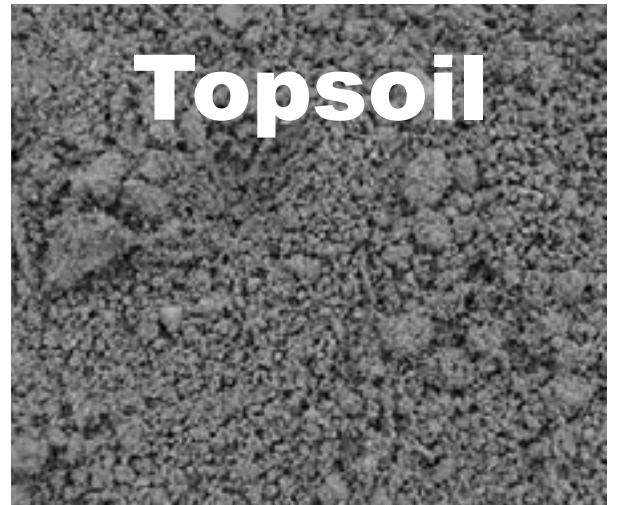

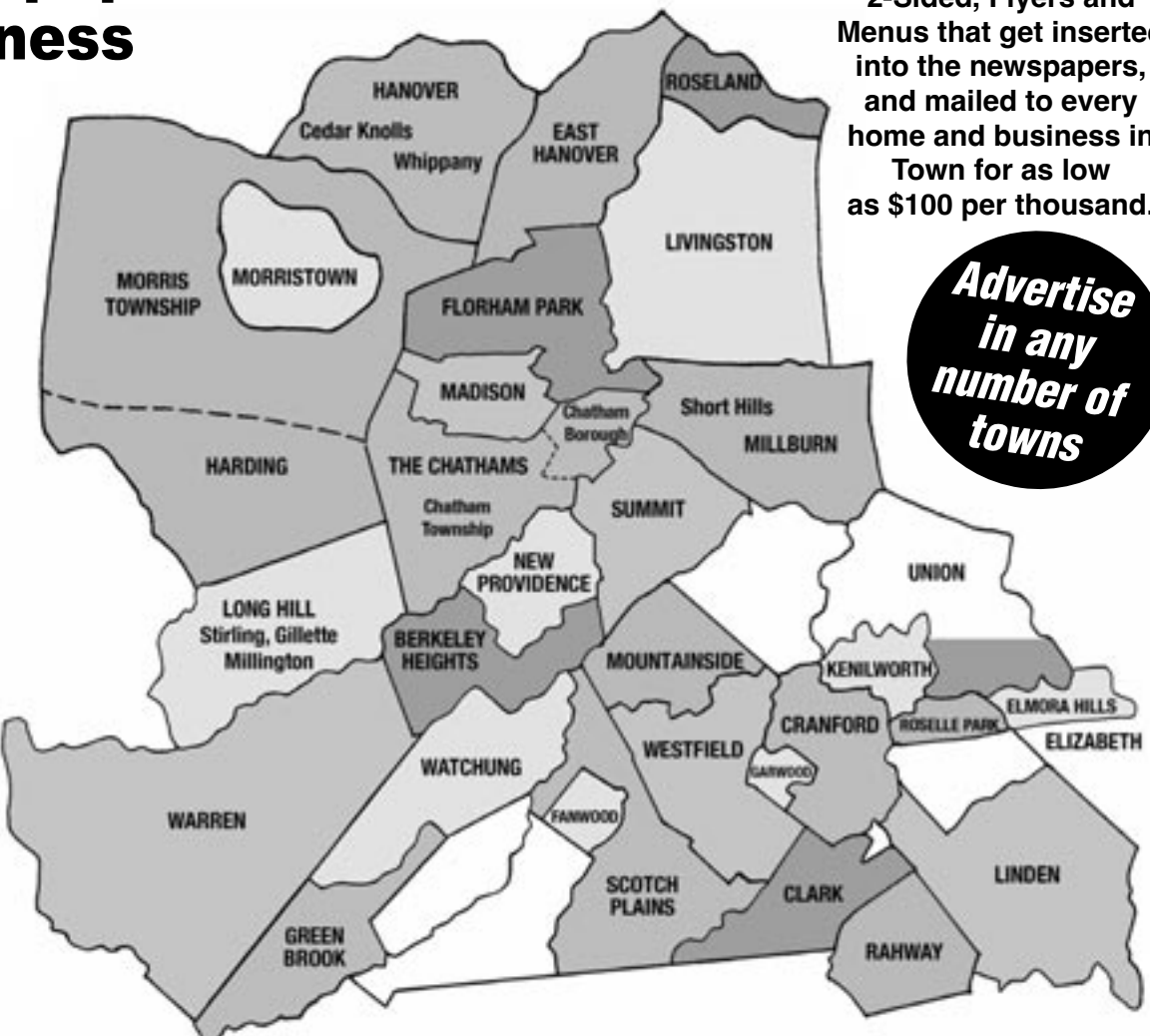

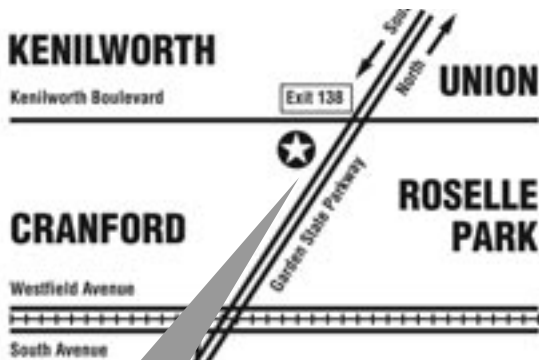
