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YOUR DOCTOR SAYS YOU HAVE OSTEOPOROSIS. NOW WHAT?

The diagnosis that scares most people into doing nothing, and why the right response is exactly the opposite

A few years ago, Sandy walked into Active Life Fitness with a diagnosis she wasn't expecting: osteoporosis. She then vowed to do whatever it took to get healthier. Two years later, her bone density tests show significant improvement.

Joan was 72 when she joined, with osteoporosis and a goal of building upper body strength. After a little over a year, her bone density had improved from osteoporosis to osteopenia. A meaningful clinical step in the right direction. Her doctor credited her consistent attendance.

And then there is Gretchen, who has been training at ALF since it first opened. At her last physical, her doctor told her that her bone density was perfect for someone over 60.

Three women. Three diagnoses. Three stories of measurable, documented bone density improvement. Not from medication alone but from strength training.

WHAT OSTEOPOROSIS ACTUALLY IS AND WHY IT'S SO COMMON

Osteoporosis is a condition in which bones become less dense and more fragile, increasing the risk of fractures from falls, and sometimes from simple, everyday movements. It is extraordinarily common: approximately one in two women and one in four men over the age of 50 will experience an osteoporosis-related fracture in their lifetime.

Osteopenia is the precursor. It's below-normal bone density that has not yet reached the threshold for osteoporosis. Both conditions develop unnoticed, with no symptoms, until a fracture occurs. By the time most people are diagnosed, significant bone loss has already happened.

The standard medical response is medication. And medication has its place. But here is what people are not always told by their doctors: strength training is one of the most effective interventions for both preventing further bone density loss and, in many cases, improvement, at any age.

WHY STRENGTH TRAINING WORKS ON BONE

Bone is living tissue. Like muscle, it responds to the demands placed on it. When you apply load to your skeleton through resistance exercise, your body responds by building new bone tissue to meet that demand. This is the principle behind weight-bearing exercise for bone health, and it is supported by decades of research.

Progressive resistance training is the most effective form of exercise for bone density. Exercises that load the spine, hips, and wrists (the sites most vulnerable to osteoporotic fracture) directly stimulate bone remodeling in those areas.

It is never too late. Studies consistently show that older adults, including those already diagnosed with osteoporosis, can improve bone density through structured strength training. The body's ability to build bone does not disappear with age. It just requires the right stimulus.

Muscle and bone work together. Stronger muscles mean better balance and coordination, which reduces fall risk, which is the immediate danger for someone with brittle bones. Building strength is not just about the bone itself. It is about protecting the whole system.

The results are measurable. Bone density is tracked through DEXA scans, typically ordered by your doctor every one to two years. The members quoted in this article saw measurable improvement on those scans, not just a feeling of being stronger, but clinical evidence.

WHAT MOST PEOPLE DO INSTEAD AND WHY IT DOESN'T WORK

The most common response to an osteoporosis diagnosis is caution. People become afraid of falling, afraid of fractures, afraid of doing the wrong thing. So they move less. They avoid the gym. They stick to gentle walking, because they hear it's weight-bearing, and hope for the best.

This is understandable. But it is not an effective approach.

Walking is valuable for general health but does not apply sufficient mechanical

load to stimulate meaningful bone formation. Gentle movement maintains what you have, at best. It does not reverse the trend.

The irony of osteoporosis is that the very thing most people avoid, loading the skeleton with resistance exercise, is the thing most likely to improve it. Inactivity accelerates bone loss. Appropriate, progressive strength training slows it considerably. And for many people, it supports real, documented improvement.

THE RIGHT PROGRAM MAKES ALL THE DIFFERENCE

We want to be clear about something: not all exercise is appropriate for every person with osteoporosis. High-impact activities, heavy spinal flexion, and certain twisting movements pose a real risk to fragile bones. A well-designed program accounts for all of this.

At Active Life Fitness, every member begins with a personal assessment. We learn about their history, their diagnosis, their current fitness level, and their goals. Members with osteoporosis or osteopenia work with certified coaches who understand the condition and know how to apply progressive load safely, protect vulnerable joints, and build strength without risk.

Every member also receives regular body composition analysis using the InBody 270, which tracks muscle mass, fat mass, and body water independently. For members with bone density concerns, monitoring muscle mass is especially important because muscle and bone health are directly linked, and building one supports the other.

A NOTE ON WHERE TO START

One of the most common things I hear from new members is some version of: "I didn't think I was in good enough shape to join a gym." Or: "I was afraid I'd hurt myself."

The women whose stories appear in this article all felt that way. Sandy came in on medication and a vow to turn things around.

All of them were beginners. All of them improved. None of them needed to be in shape first.

A diagnosis of osteoporosis or osteopenia is not a reason to stop moving. It is the most compelling reason to start.

Recently, The New York Blood Center held a dinner to recognize the agencies who have helped them collect donations. The Clark Volunteer Emergency Squad is proud to be one of their top performing agencies. To date, the New York Blood Center has collected 903 pints from drives held at CVES. That is an amazing accomplishment – and we have the community to thank. All the donors who give a vital part of themselves to help others are true heroes. Each pint saves up to three lives.

We are ending the prom and graduation season when many new and inexperienced drivers are

involved in motor vehicle accidents but that does not lessen the need for blood. The summer months have a great need for blood. The warm weather brings people out and it is easy to become distracted. That is when accidents happen. Surgeries are still scheduled so the need for blood continues.

You must be between 17 (with parental consent) and 75 years of age (over 75 needs written consent from a physician). Prepare to donate by eating well and drinking plenty of fluids. You will need a photo ID, feel good, be symptom-free, and meet the minimum weight requirements.

As a reminder, blood donors can give every 56 days, and platelet donors can give twice a month. Several blood donor eligibility restrictions have been lifted by the Food and Drug Administration (FDA). To view current eligibility guidelines, visit nybc.org/eligibility. In addition to designing the activity, the high school students led it, providing a true opportunity for student leadership.

Ms. Jacobi stated, “I am beyond proud of my SNHS students for sharing such an incredibly fun filled day with our 3rd graders. We could see the excitement in their eyes, and hear it as they screamed with delight as they moved from station to station. Not only were my students instrumental in providing incredible opportunities to foster their love of science with the younger students, but they shined in their enthusiasm, their compassion, and their leadership as they guided the students through such a magical morning.”

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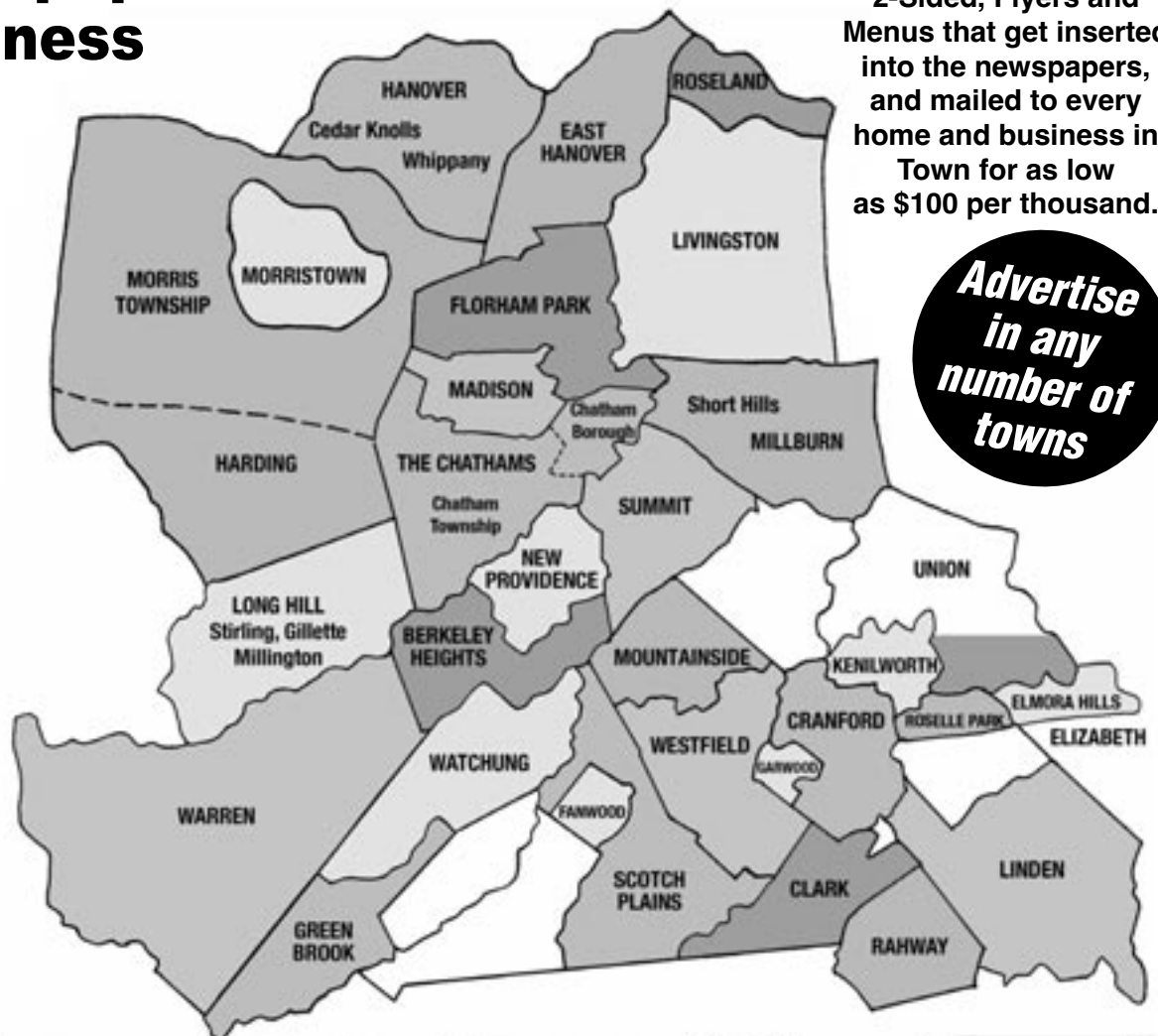

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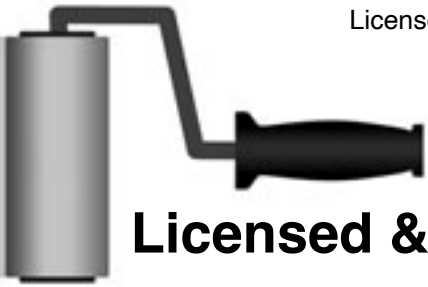
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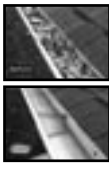
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
